Alcohol: 14% vol.

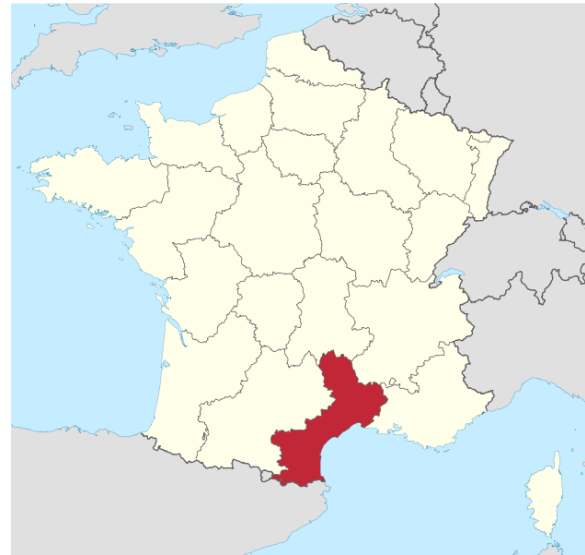
Tasting Notes

Appearance: Golden

Nose: Apricots, peaches and violets.

Palate: Peach, apple, pear, lavender and honey. Round and soft, fresh and well-balanced. Light sweetness and spicy fragrance.

Pairing: Asian dishes, spicy foods, and smoked almonds!



Languedoc-Roussillon Wine Region of France

Climate: Languedoc is usually warm and dry throughout the year, and has very mild winters. It borders the Mediterranean Sea on one side of the region, which lends more warmth to the climate.

Languedoc is the largest wine-producing area in France; it produces more wine in this area than in the entire United States. This is also one of the most innovative wine regions in the world today thanks to innovative wine producers that have been changing the wines produced in this area since the 1990s.

A wide variety of grapes are grown in this region including: syrah, grenache, cabernet sauvignon, and chardonnay. There are four AOC regions within Languedoc, or wines can be classified as "Vins de Pays d'Oc."
