Rosé Réserve
PAYS D'OC (FRANCE)

Mas de la Source produces a wide variety of wines in the heart of the Languedoc in Southern France, using traditional Mediterranean varieties that thrive in the heat of the region, including, in the reserve red, Grenache and Cabernet Sauvignon. The vineyards enjoy a high proportion of granitic topsoil, overlaying a subsoil of sand and clay with a very deep water-table, forcing vines to grow deep and impossibly complex root networks in order to obtain the water that is so vital in the harsh, dry summers. Garrigue herbs of the region grow nearby and contribute to the herbaceous minerality of the terroir.

Grapes: 60% Cinsault, 40% Grenache

Alcohol: 12.5%

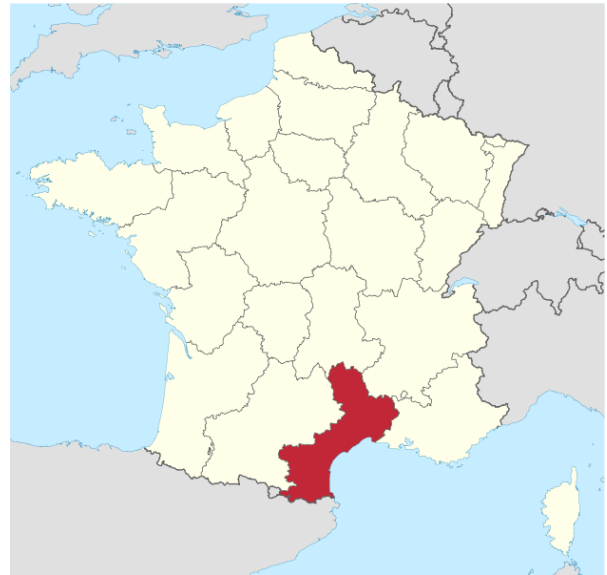
Tasting Notes

Appearance: Pale rose

Nose: Lush red fruits and roses.

Palate: Soft, ripe and freshness- strawberry, raspberry and rose petal.

Pairing: Barbeques, canapés & salads



Languedoc-Roussillon Wine Region of France

Climate: Languedoc is usually warm and dry throughout the year, and has very mild winters. It borders the Mediterranean Sea on one side of the region, which lends more warmth to the climate.

Languedoc is the largest wine-producing area in France; it produces more wine in this area than in the entire United States. This is also one of the most innovative wine regions in the world today thanks to innovative wine producers that have been changing the wines produced in this area since the 1990s.

A wide variety of grapes are grown in this region including: Syrah, Grenache, Cabernet Sauvignon, and Chardonnay. There are four AOC regions within Languedoc, or wines can be classified as “Vins de Pays d’Oc”.
