



## Outon Albariño

RÍAS BAIXAS (SPAIN)  
From the DO Rías Baixas

Since 1975 the Simon Ferro family has been producing wines in the Rio Miño valley. One of the first wineries in the Rías Baixas region they also were founding members of the Regulating Council. Their 30 year-old vines help make this Albariño one of distinction and high quality.

**Alcohol:** 12.5% vol.

**Grapes:** 100% Albariño

**Viticulture:** Aged in stainless steel

### Tasting Notes

**Nose:** Intense aroma of green apples and pineapple.

**Palate:** Dry with moderate acidity. Flavors of pear, lemon zest and herbs.

**Pairing:** Great with seafood, cheeses, capers and grilled chicken.

## Rías Baixas Wine Region of Spain

**Climate:** Rías Baixas has an Atlantic climate that is more cool and damp due to its location. It is different than the stereotypical Mediterranean Spain.

**Rías Baixas DO** is located in the far north-western corner of Spain in the region of Galicia. Established in 1988 the land is lush and green with mountains, very similar to Ireland. Named after the deep and wide inlets of water (ría) that connects to the Atlantic, the southern group of these rías are known as Rías Baixas.

The region owes much of its fame to the white grape **Albariño**, which has become one of Spain's most notable white wines.

Wines from **Rías Baixas** are known to have good natural acidity with pronounced mineral notes. There are five sub zones in the Rías Baixas which can produce wines ranging from light to medium bodied and moderate alcohol. Typically



pale golden yellow, they are very aromatic and delicious as an aperitif or paired with light fare such as seafood or salads.
