



Secret de Berticot Sauvignon Blanc CÔTES DE DURAS (FRANCE)

BERTICOT represents today 118 winegrowers spread across 1000 hectares of land (55% of the AOP Côtes de Duras). The co-op has a cellar equipped with modern material, capable of making 50,000 hectoliters of wine. It has become a renowned brand in France, Europe and awarded in all top competitions.

Grapes: Sauvignon Blanc

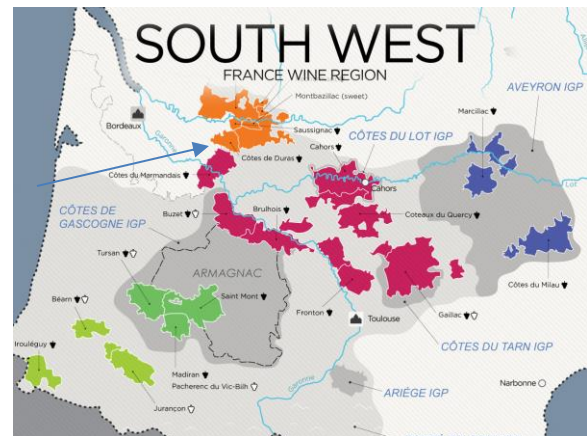
Alcohol: 12.5% vol.

Color: Pale straw color

Nose: Attractive, baked aromas and flavors of wildflowers, baked pears, honeyed dried apricots, and dried banana

Palate: Lively, dry light-to-medium body and a complex, long meadow brook stones, celery leaf, kiwi, lemon, and melon, and coconut water finish with fine, fruit tannins. A divine subtle white, reminiscent of a picnic in the French countryside.

Pairings: Serve as an aperitif, or with smoked salmon mousse, Thai dishes, pastas, poultry, shellfish.



Côtes de Duras Wine Region of France

Climate: The Côtes de Duras oceanic climate is identical to that of the Bordeaux region, except that it experiences slightly more extreme temperatures because of its distance from the ocean. This wine-growing area is situated in the northwest of Lot-et-Garonne where it borders the Gironde and Dordogne departments.

Côtes de Duras is an Appellation d'Origine Contrôlée (AOC) for red and white wines in South West France. Côtes de Duras is located in the department of Lot-et-Garonne, and is located immediately adjacent to the Bordeaux wine region.

White wines are primarily Sauvignon Blanc, Sémillon, Muscadelle, Mauzac, Roucheloin or Chenin Blanc and Ondenc. Ugni Blanc is a supplementary grape variety that may not exceed 25% of the total used. Red wines are Cabernet Sauvignon, Cabernet Franc, Merlot and Côt (Malbec).
